FAMILY DEVOTIONAL

We designed this devotional as a way to help you think about Advent themes during the entire month. There is one devotional reading for each Sunday of Advent. Choose a specific time each Sunday when you will do the devotion, and try to be consistent from week to week.



If using this devotion with an Advent Wreath, light the appropriate candles before beginning the specific devotion. One way to engage your kids is to light the candle and say what it represents as you light it. For example, if you are beginning Week 3 you might say, “The first week we talked about the coming of Jesus and Hope [light Hope candle], last week we talked about the coming of Jesus and Love [light Love candle]. After the devotional blow the candles out or let your kids have fun doing it.

Each devotion contains a passage of Scripture, a brief reflection on that passage, sample prayers to guide the

prayers of children and adults, and hymns to sing together to give voice to your praises and longings. We’ve chosen these Christmas hymns to correspond with the devotion’s theme, but feel free to sing a song more familiar to your family. Songs can be streamed directly from Clear Creek’s Advent webpage so you can sing along with your family.

Each weekly devotional also contains an illustration that can be colored by the children before or after you do the devotion. You may want to display these or send them to friends and family as a way to remember and celebrate the Advent season.

We have also included readings from a various assortment of children’s Bibles (e.g., *The Jesus Storybook Bible*). Identify the one your kids have and then use it for the devotions.

We hope this Advent Devotional might become a new Christmas tradition that helps your family remember that this holiday season is ultimately about the Good News that Christ the King came to rescue and redeem us back to God.

“In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth.”

That’s the start of the Christmas story.

God created a beautiful world, full of life and love and happiness. The first people in the whole universe, Adam and Eve, were friends with God. But then evil entered the world, and everything was broken. Satan, the enemy of God, introduced sin (or disobedience to God) to Adam and Eve, and God’s beautiful world was broken, like a mirror being shattered into hundreds of little pieces.

But, that wasn’t the end of the story; it was only the beginning. God had a plan to fix what was broken and he promised that he would. He said he would send someone to make things right.

Years went by and people were waiting for God’s promise to come true. They waited a long time, so God told a man named Isaiah to remind everyone that he would keep his promise. Isaiah said, “Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel [which means “God with us”],” (Isaiah 7:14). So, everyone kept waiting.

This is where the story picks up for us today. An angel appeared to Mary and said, “Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High.”

God was keeping his promise! He was sending the one who would make things right – a baby named Jesus. Jesus was the one Isaiah was talking about – Immanuel. God with us.

So, the coming of Jesus isn’t just a fun story to tell at Christmas time. Christmas reminds us that God keeps his promises. God always does all that he has promised. God kept his biggest promise: he has come to be with us!



God tells us that he loves us. The Bible says, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life," (John 3:16). That is amazing! But what does God mean when he says he loves us?

You might really like something, like ice cream, because it makes you happy. Is that how God loves us? You might like the way someone makes you feel because they are nice to you. Is that how God loves us?

The Bible describes God's love in a variety of ways, but it is very clear that God's love is never-ending and better than we can even imagine.

God's love is different than what we might think of as love. God doesn't love us because of how good we are or because we are nice to him. God loves us because he decided he wants to. The Bible says that God loved us "while we were still sinners." God decided he would love us even when we didn't love him.

You see, you can say you love someone over and over and

over again. You can tell everyone you see that you love someone. But do you really love them if you only say you do? No one knows.

God didn't just say he loves us. He proved it by what he did. He sent his Son, Jesus, to the world to rescue us.

So when Isaiah said "Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel [or "God with us"]," (Isaiah 7:14) and then an angel appeared to Joseph saying it was time for this thing to happen, God was showing his love to all his people. He wasn't just saying he loved us, he was doing something about it.

The birth of Jesus is so important because it reminds that God is with us, he always keeps his promises, and he loves us more than we could ever know.

Help us share your extravagant love with our unchurched friends and neighbors this Christmas season. In the name of Jesus Christ, we pray. Amen

God is in the business of unexpected victories. When it looks like there is no way he could possibly win, those are the moments God gets to show us who he really is.

So, when no one had heard from God for hundreds of years, and then suddenly Jesus – Immanuel, God with us – was born, the angels rejoiced! The shepherds went to the stable to see if it could possibly be true. And the wise men saw a star in the sky and traveled to Bethlehem to worship the new king.

God is here! He is with us! Everything is going to be okay!

Jesus, the hero, had entered the story.

A lot of bad stuff had happened before Jesus was born. Life was hard. But people had joy because of what God had promised them. They were excited that he was going to save them. And then when it happened, they got to celebrate even more. Jesus – the Savior, the King, the Messiah – had finally come.

But later, when Jesus died on the cross, it looked like bad things were happening again. Everyone was stunned. The hero was dead. It looked like there was no way God could possibly win.

But then, God did the impossible. Jesus walked out of the tomb. He was alive. The hero had won!

And then, he made another promise that he would come back again and set everything right.

So even on the scariest days, when there appears to be no way to win, we can look to the hero of this grand story and find joy. We can find joy in the beauty he's put into the world and in the way he is still doing impossible things in people's lives. And, we can have joy now, because as followers of Jesus, we already know how the story ends.



God's messenger, Isaiah, said Jesus was going to be the "Prince of Peace" (Isaiah 9:6).

We think of peace as being a time where there is no fighting and everyone's happy. But we know that doesn't happen very often. We learn in history class about all kinds of wars. We hear about all sorts of bad things on the news. So, how can Jesus be the "Prince of Peace"?

Well, it helps to think about what the Bible means when it talks about peace. When the Bible talks about peace, a lot of times it's not talking about fighting, it's talking about the idea of something being whole or complete, like a puzzle with all the pieces put in place, or a perfectly built wall with no cracks. Peace means something is perfect.

And here's the really wonderful thing about the story of Jesus Christ: he *is* the Prince of Peace. Jesus puts things back together. He can fix what has been broken. He does heal the hurting. He's always done that, and he always will.

At the beginning of the story, sin entered the world, and we said it was like a mirror being shattered. But as followers of Jesus, we know the Prince of Peace is going to put all those broken pieces back together. Jesus – Immanuel, "God with us" – is going to fix everything, and we will get to be with him forever.

That's why Christmas is about more than just a baby born on a peaceful night; it's about a baby born to bring about a peace-filled eternity.
