A Theology of Vocation

1. How do you think people feel about their ordinary life? What are reasons people might feel dissatisfied with it?
 - What specific areas of life can feel the flattest?
 - What do you typically think about when you hear the word vocation?
 - How did the sermon define the Christian practice vocation?
2. Read Genesis 1:26–28:
 - How would the original readers have understood the phrase “image of God”?
 - What does being made in the image of God say about humans?
3. Read Colossians 1:16 and Genesis 2:15:
 - What does Colossians say about humans? What does that mean?
 - Why is that an important truth to embrace?
 - What unique task were humans made for in Genesis 2? How does humanity partner with God in stewarding God’s world?
4. Read Philippians 2:5-7
 - What stands out to you in the text?
 - How does sin fracture our vocation? Where do you see that play out in everyday life?
 - Why does Jesus’ humanity give us hope?
 - How does Jesus ultimately restore our vocation?
5. What ways is God’s Spirit calling you to respond in light of this sermon?
6. What did you discover by taking the SHAPE assessment? What next steps is God compelling you to take?
